D. Presentation and Discussion Highlights

- 1. Academics Update
- Upcoming February Meeting:

Melissa Holt (Elementary) and Richie Vaughn (Over Testing) will be presenting.

- 2. Updates from the North Region
- Mr. Santana (for Dr. Fleming):
 - Mid-year testing is wrapping up; principals are encouraged to bring comparisons with initial tests to SAC meetings.
 - The Middle School Expo, proposed by Cynthia last year, led to the District's first showcase this year, with positive early feedback.

Dr. Fleming:

- Emphasized the increased support for schools with high numbers of new teachers (70% of teachers in some schools are in their first 3 years). The regional office is providing additional coaching.
- 3. Feedback from the All-School Showcase:
- Positive: Great participation from various schools, including technical programs and a well-executed event.
- Areas for Improvement:
 - Tight spaces upstairs (Middle/High Schools).
 - o Directions were unclear; better guidance needed.
 - Schools should be arranged by zones or regions for clarity.
 - Focus on marketing to people outside of Broward Schools.
- Next Year: Consider QR codes for attendance tracking and feedback collection.
- 4. Testing Best Practices

Principal Suggestions:

- o Mimic high-stakes testing in classroom assessments.
- Ensure support staff check in with students with 504 plans.
- Ensure breakfast options are available for latecomers.
- **Incentives:** Encouraged use of community partners for testing incentives, such as free prom tickets for proficient students.
- Policy Changes for EOC Waivers: Graduation requirement grades are unlikely to be waived.
- 5. Local School Experience
- Rewards and Incentives:
 - Schools using game rooms, craft rooms, or science rooms for incentives.
 - o Parking spots awarded for student nominations.
 - PTA-run school store open Tuesday/Thursday mornings.
- Parents are encouraged to volunteer at high school stores and programs.
- 6. Food and Nutrition Updates
- Community Eligibility Program: Requires completion of waivers for students receiving free lunch.
- **Share Table:** Unused food from the cafeteria can be donated to families in need. Review scheduled for March.
- Medical Statement: Required annually to request special meal accommodations.
- 7. Policy Changes
- 1020 Policy:
 - Public speaking time limited to 10 minutes per person.
 - Chair reports count towards speaking time.
- 1070 Policy:
 - Chair terms reduced to 2 years. A chair cannot serve on more than one board.
- 8. Academic and Grading Updates
- School Improvement Plans (SIPs): Encourage SAC/SAF chairs to request academic data from school administrators during meetings.
- 9. State-Mandated Instruction:
- Focus on mental health and other mandates, including tools like Laurie's Kids. Discussion on the Broward Mental Health Allocation Plan for 2024-2025.
- Upcoming Mental Health Fair or Expo to provide resources and parent/student sessions.
- Potential subcommittee meeting in the last week of February/early March.

 SAC/SAF chairs encouraged to inquire about social worker staffing and availability at schools. Many social workers cover multiple schools.

• Efforts are underway to invite SEDNET representatives to speak at a future meeting.
